Outdoor Activities:

Metro Museum:

Sixty students from Subhash camp, Nebsarai 1, 2 and 3 visited Metro Museum on 13 Oct 2012. Mr.N.D.Khanna, Curator of Metro Museum organized the trip. Mr.Khanna explained the students about the history, work and security of Metro Museum. There are unique collections of 'Photographs of the Delhi Metro'. He explained the story behind each pictures. He also took the students for a Metro ride from Central Secretariat to Patel Nagar.

Air Force Museum:

Sixty students from Subhash Camp, Nebsarai 1, 2 and 3 visited Indian Air Force (IAF) Museum on 13 October 2012. The IAF Museum offers an insight not only into the history of the Indian Air Force but also gives a complete picture of military aviation in India. This museum displays photographs from initial days when Indian aviators flew for the Royal Flying Corps during the First World War right up to the days of the Kargil operations. The students also saw the real aircrafts of Indian Air Force. They also had a glimpse of several broken Pakistani aircraft, tanks, vehicles captured during 1965 and 1971 war.

Heritage Walk:

Twenty students from Tigri # 1, Sangam Vihar # 1, 2 and Mehrauli participated in a heritage walk to Safdarjung's Tomb. It was organized by Shahjahnabad Redevelopment Corporation (SRDC). The Heritage Consultant SRDC, Dr. Navina Jafa conducted the walk. She provided the information on conservation and other archaeological details. Built in 1754 in the late Mughal Empire style, Safdarjung's Tomb is described as the last flicker in the lamp of Mughal architecture".
